PROFESSIONAL TEACHER'S ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR VIRGINIA LICENSURE

VIRGINIA TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAMS

Section <u>22.1-298.2</u> of the *Code of Virginia* requires that the Virginia Board of Education prescribe assessments for individuals seeking admission into an approved teacher preparation program. On March 18, 2010, the Board approved a recommendation of the Advisory Board on Teacher Education and Licensure to allow the use of the Virginia Communication and Literacy Assessment (Reading and Writing) as an optional test for the Praxis I Reading and Writing tests for individuals seeking entry into a teacher preparation program. An individual choosing to use the VCLA (Reading and Writing) as an optional assessment for the Praxis I Reading and Writing tests will be required to meet the Praxis I Mathematics assessment (or equivalent SAT or ACT test scores).

The Board of Education will continue to allow the use of a composite score of the Praxis Reading, Writing, and Mathematics tests to meet the Praxis I assessment requirement and the use of the SAT and ACT as substitute tests for Praxis I (Reading, Writing, and Mathematics) for individuals seeking admission into a teacher preparation program.

SAT AS A SUBSTITUTE TEST FOR PRAXIS I

The board approved the following scores:

<u>SAT Taken Prior to April 1, 1995</u>—a score of **1000** with at least **450** on the verbal and **510** on the mathematics tests;

<u>SAT Taken After April 1, 1995</u>—a score of 1100 with at least 530 on the verbal and 530 on the mathematics tests as a substitute for Praxis I.

Please note that the SAT® was approved as a substitute test <u>only</u> for Praxis I; individuals also must meet the Praxis II (subject area assessment) for initial licensure.

ACT AS A SUBSTITUTE TEST FOR PRAXIS I

The Board of Education approved the use of the ACT as a substitute test for Praxis I (Reading, Writing, and Mathematics). The board approved the following scores:

<u>ACT Taken Prior to April 1, 1995</u>—a composite score of 21, with the ACT mathematics score no less than 21, and an ACT English Plus Reading score no less than 37. [Please note that you must have taken and met passing scores for the ACT <u>Mathematics</u> and <u>English Plus Reading</u> tests. At one time, the English Plus Reading test was not offered.]

<u>ACT Taken After April 1, 1995</u>—a composite score of 24, with the ACT mathematics score no less than 22, and an ACT English Plus Reading score no less than 46.

Please note that the ACT was approved as a substitute test <u>only</u> for Praxis I; individuals also must meet the Praxis II (subject area assessment) for initial licensure.

VIRGINIA COMMUNICATION AND LITERACY ASSESSMENT (effective January 1, 2006)

The Virginia Communication and Literacy Assessment became effective January 1, 2006, for initial licensure unless an individual meets the exemption criteria. On March 22, 2006, the Board of Education approved cut scores for the Virginia Communication and Literacy Assessment (VCLA). The cut scores for the VCLA are as follows:

PRAXIS II: SPECIALTY AREA TESTS

The following tests are required for the following endorsement (teaching specialty) areas for initial licensure. Individuals are required to satisfy the Specialty Area test(s) requirement for only one endorsement area, but it must match an endorsement area in which initial licensure is granted. VIRGINIA READING ASSESSMENT (VRA)

Individuals seeking initial licensure with endorsements in the following areas must take the Virginia Reading Assessment for Elementary and Special Education Teachers (Test Code 001) unless the exemption criteria are met:

Early/Primary prek-3	Special Education-General Curriculum
Elementary Education prek-6	Special Education-Hearing Impairments

Note: This assessment also may apply to those individuals with endorsements in Special Education-Emotional Disturbances, Special Education-Specific Learning Disabilities, and Special Education-Mental Retardation who were advised under previous regulations to meet this assessment requirement for full licensure.

Individuals seeking an endorsement as a Reading Specialist must take the Virginia Reading Assessment for Reading Specialists (Test Code 002).

The VRA became a requirement July 1, 2004. Individuals who take the VRA after July 1, 2006, will be required to meet a passing score established by the Virginia Board of Education. The Board of Education established cut scores for the Virginia Reading Assessments for elementary and special education teachers at **235** and for reading specialists at **245**, effective July 1, 2006.
